Sherry Harris, our incoming Foundation Board Trustee lives, loves, and gives! She has many accolades and the education to back it up. A resident of Statesville, North Carolina she was honored with the Governor's Volunteer Award for her volunteer contributions in many non-profit organizations. Her extensive experience includes being a board member of a domestic violence shelter, a Boys and Girls club, an advocacy group for long-term care residents, and a cancer support services organization. Sherry provides public relations and fundraising efforts to ensure these organizations continue their vital work.

Sherry serves in Christian ministry as a Stephen Minister trained in the Episcopal faith. She was awarded the Circle of Quality Service while employed with a large hospital system in Raleigh.

Sherry is a Rotarian and the President-Elect/Secretary of the Greater Statesville Club. She facilitated at the Rotary Leadership Institute and was awarded the Paul Harris Fellow. Her Inner Wheel leadership experi-

ence started as Club President, progressed to District Chair and Treasurer, and was the Coordinator of the Footsteps for the IW USA Foundation event.

### **ROSE COUNCIL AWARD LEVELS**

Awards in the form of an oval pin are given to donors who have donated at least \$1,000 to the Foundation. Donors then become a Rose

Council member. As their donations increase to the following levels, the donor receives a jeweled pin for each level. Donors of \$2,000 receive a jeweled rose. Donors of \$5,000 receive a sapphire jewel. \$10,000 in donations garners a ruby jewel, and \$25,000 in donations warrants an emerald jewel.

Inner Wheel USA Foundation had very generous donations last year, and with investment income larger than expected, our Financial Officer Annelise Graf found the perfect way to make use of our good fortune and to increase our outreach. She remembered Carrie Davis, an employee of Hanger Clinic who is also a counselor and resource for Camp No Limits when she was invited to be the guest speaker with the IW Club of Sacramento and at a recent Inner Wheel conference. Carrie was born without part of her arm and is an amazing role model. Annelise contacted the No Limits Foundation that funds and organizes the camp each year and learned of a sponsorship opportunity.

After the Foundation board approved a \$10,000 donation, we became a major sponsor which entitles us to have our name on their website and marketing material. We were also invited to join their virtual camp this past July. Normally an overnight and outdoor adventure, the virtual event was able to reach many more children, parents, and medical personnel due to the pandemic.

Our Chairman, Patricia Picard, and Vice Chairman, Maggie Spears, were able to participate in the virtual camp via Zoom during the occupational therapy and chat room sessions.


Maggie Spears said, "What an awesome opportunity given to me to participate in the July 2020 virtual Camp No Limits Occupational Therapy session.

This was an unexpected opportunity to broaden our reach and name in communities across the country and the world.





to deliver a Convention that will fulfill its purpose to the fullest. Dates and timings have been shifted to suit international participants.



# **LESSONS FROM GEESE**

<u>Fact 1:</u> As each goose flaps its wings it creates an "uplift" for the following birds. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew alone.

<u>Lesson1:</u> People who share a common direction and sense of community get where they are going quicker and easier traveling on the thrust of one another.

<u>Fact 2:</u> When a goose falls out of formation, it feels the drag and resistance of flying alone. It quickly moves back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird in front of it.

<u>Lesson 2:</u> When we stay in formation with those headed where we want to go, we are willing to accept their help and give our help to others.

Fact 3: When the lead goose tires, it rotates back into the formation and another goose flies to the point position.

<u>Lesson 3:</u> It pays to take turns doing the hard tasks and sharing leadership. As with geese, people are interdependent on each other's skills, capabilities, and unique arrangements of gifts, talents, or resources.

Fact 4: Geese flying in formation honk to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

<u>Lesson 4:</u> We can ensure our honking is encouraging. In groups where there is encouragement, the production is much greater. The power of encouragement (to stand by one's heart or core values and encourage the heart and core of others) is the quality of honking we seek.

<u>Fact 5:</u> When a goose gets sick, wounded, or shot down, two geese drop out of formation and follow it down to help and protect it, until it dies or can fly again. Then, they join another formation or catch up with the flock.

Lesson 5: We all benefit when we will stand by each other in difficult times as well as when we are strong.

# IN THE SPOT LIGHT—Norma Trillia



What comes to mind when talking with Norma, is her enthusiastic and practical nature. She didn't look for leadership, but when the opportunity presented itself, she rose to the occasion.

Norma grew up on a ranch in Argentina, speaking English, French, and Spanish. Her introduction to Inner Wheel came in 1955 as a student in Canada. She and her husband George were expecting their first child when a friend mentioned that her sister was a member of Inner Wheel and they were giving out baby layettes. Soon, a huge box arrived with everything

for her baby. This made a tremendous impression on Norma, a young mom far from home. Life became busy and never got to say thank you before she moved back to Argentina.

There, George joined Rotary, but no one seemed to know about Inner Wheel. Norma stayed in Argentina raising her 5 children until 1981 when the family moved to California. Again, when she inquired about Inner Wheel, the Rotarian's said "Inner what?" Finally, she heard an Inner Wheel presentation at George's District meeting in Oakland CA. Her Inner Wheel journey began when she chartered the Inner Wheel Club of El Cerrito in 1986 and was installed as President.

In 1989 Norma started District 516 and quickly moved into increasingly higher leadership roles from District President, to Zone 5 Representative, to Inner Wheel USA (IWUSA) Vice President. In 1994 she served as the IWUSA President and the USA National Representative, attending the IIW meeting near Manchester England. In 1996/1997 she was an IIW Board Director, going to the IIW Convention in Berlin. Her practical side showed up when Norma convinced the IIW leadership to assign duties enabling the IIW board to be more effective. Norma's three years with the Foundation began in 2001 as a trustee, then as Secretary under Melba Rilott. In 2012 she was again elected as an IIW Board Director. Norma has attended all ten triennial conventions since 1997 and continuing with this year's virtual convention. Her penchant for travelling abroad and ease with people and languages made her an especially effective national representative on the world stage.

In addition to Norma's Inner Wheel involvement, she taught English as a second language in Argentina. After moving to California, she helped her daughters run a home day care, and a golf course renovation business. She no longer plays golf or fishes but stays active swimming and cycling. Norma also enjoys knitting and makes teddy bears with her El Cerrito club members. They distribute these unique bears to seniors in assisted living homes and to police as offerings to children in crisis. Norma tells of a woman who was given a knitted teddy bear and started chatting away to it. Later she learned the woman had not talked for years until that moment.

Norma said her best experiences were meeting wonderful women from around the world. She feels that we are all just the same. Norma's dedication to Inner Wheel has been her way to say thank you for that young mother who received a huge baby layette from a stranger.
